**Learning From Our Youth:** Brothers, in the month of January I had the honor of attending the installation of Officers for one of our Masonic youth organizations, Job's Daughters, at Bethel 52 in Herndon Virginia. This was an open installation and there were three things from that experience that struck me and made a strong impression. One was a line from the installation ritual. The second was a song used during the program. The third was a line in the closing of their installation ritual.

The line from the installation ritual that first grabbed my attention was a charge made to the incoming senior officer. To paraphrase the line, she was charged *to become so well versed in literature, the arts and music that she could lead and influence others to take nobler paths in life*. That line caused me to pause and reflect. To become so well versed in literature, the arts and music that we could lead and influence others to take nobler paths in life, implying that we as individuals could personally take nobler paths in life. I could not help but recall a similar, more detailed portion of some of our own degrees. First, I thought of the lecture in our Fellowcraft degree. Second, I thought of ensuring to take time to

study these topics as we are instructed, with managing our time per the working tools of an Entered Apprentice, our own individual ritualistic time as a youth. It challenged me to reflect on how else I could more effectively use time to study these topics.

The time that I was struck during this experience was by a song. A part of the installation was spent playing a song. I was at first admittedly annoyed that a three-minute modern popular song was integrated into the ceremony. I noticed that most of the adults, myself included were squirming and a little uncomfortable with taking a few minutes while this song played. I also noticed that the girls were listening to it and were moved by it. Then I thought, this song means something to these girls, so I will patiently endure it. Then after deeper reflection – it dawned on me. This song means something to them and is important... Music is important. They are practicing what they just charged their senior officer with doing. I also reflected that our ancient brethren used to take time to incorporate music into their lodge experience. Music, along with the other liberal arts and sciences is an important part of Masonry and should be incorporated into our Masonic and Lodge experiences.

The third time that I was stuck during this experience was by a line in their closing where they thanked Freemasonry for their heritage. I have to say that I was filled with a sense of pride after hearing this – for lots of reasons. Overall, it was a very enlightening experience. I would encourage you to take time this year to attend a Masonic youth event and to support them with an open mind and you might learn more than you expected. Yours in service.

Brethren, February is Heart Health Month. Did you know that Heart disease is the leading cause of death for men and women in the United States? Every year, 1 in 4 deaths are caused by heart disease.

The good news? Heart disease can often be prevented when people make healthy choices and manage their health conditions. Communities, health professionals, and families can work together to create opportunities for people to make healthier choices.

In case the unthinkable happens at our Lodge, there is an AED (*Automated External Defibrillator*) mounted next to the kitchen door. I am sure many of you know CPR and the use of an AED however, training is always a good idea. Indeed, a number of states require training from an authorized instructor in a Nationally Recognized criteria, to take advantage of the protections offered by the "Good Samaritan Law".

There are a great many myths and misconceptions about CPR and AED use. These can be cleared up by taking a course through a qualified professional. The American Heart Association and The American Red Cross have lists of Authorized Providers that can provide the necessary training to you. Be sure to take the course appropriate to your needs i.e.: an EMT, Nurse, etc. would need a BLS (*Basic Life Support*) class, whereas a "layperson" non-healthcare provider should take what is sometimes called a "HeartSaver" course. Some courses even include Basic First Aid! Read the course description carefully to find the one that best suits you.

Those closest to our "Hearts" may need our assistance in an emergency. While 911 is en-route, knowing the skills of CPR/AED and Basic First Aid can make a huge impact on their lives. In some cases, it can be the difference between life and death. A couple of hours of our lives in a classroom is certainly worth that! Yours in service.

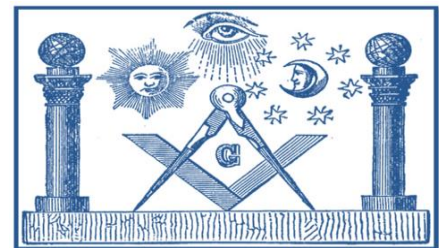
