Even if a veteran or first responder has gone to the Great Architect of the Universe during a period of peace their sacrifice should be no less honored today.

In 2000 Congress passed the National Moment of Remembrance Act, asking all people to stop and remember those heroes who have died for our country at 3:00 PM. Brethren, please take a moment at 3:00PM on our Memorial Day holidays to pause and give a short prayer or thought for those who paid the ultimate price in service to our great nation.

Brothers, I would also like for you to look out for our vets and first responders (*anyone, actually!*) who are still with us but suffering from physical and mental injuries, so that we don't have to eventually honor them on this holiday. Saints Johns Day, Charity and Leadership

"That word that the Puritans translated 'Charity', but which is really 'Love' is the keystone which supports the entire edifice of this mystic science" Anonymous – The Master's Lectures, June.

In Masonry we are charged with being just and upright and to ever walk and act as such. We are called as individuals to be a pillar, or landmark in our community. This involves application of the lessons that are both clearly taught and not easily found within freemasonry. This short talk deals with both types of lessons and is centered around one of the landmarks of Freemasonry, the Feast of Saint John the Baptist, celebrated each year on June the 24th. The hope is that you will research the lessons and symbols discussed in this small tome and find leadership applications for your own life.

The Saints John's Day feasts are two high holidays observed in Freemasonry. The first one celebrates Saint John the Baptist and occurs on June 24th of each year. The second celebrates Saint John the Evangelist and occurs on December 27th, the longest and shortest days of each year. He is regarded as a Saint or prophet by three of the world's largest religions. The

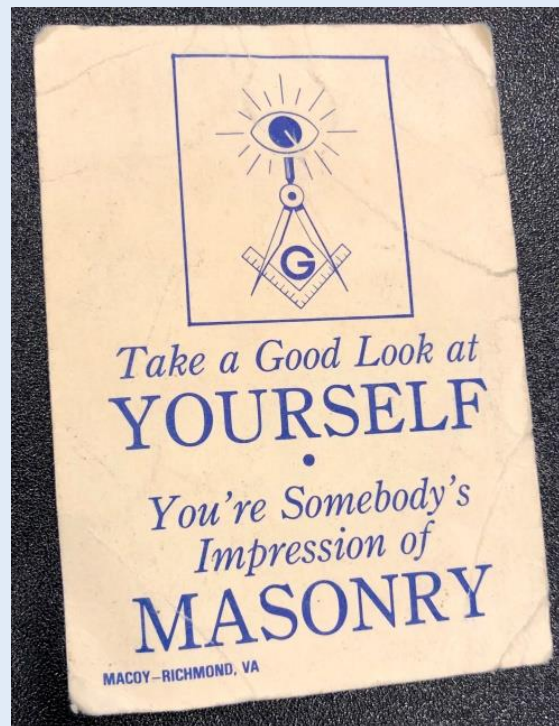
formation of the United Grand Lodge of England occurred immediately before the Feast of Saint John the Baptist and celebration of the Feasts of Saints Johns Day is a landmark of Freemasonry and often a key distinction between regular and irregular jurisdictions. It is a significant day for Freemasonry but unfortunately the meaning and reason for its important is not frequently taught. Saint John the Baptist is celebrated because he was a seeker of light and charity. Saint John the Evangelist is celebrated because he had received light and charity and shared it generously with those who would receive it. The two are depicted in masonic symbolism as the two lines that border the circumpunct – the point within the circle. John the Baptist was born approximately six months earlier than Jesus and John the Evangelist was the younger. John the Baptist represents youth, energetic zeal, and passion. John the Evangelist represents old age, tempered intellect, and reason. The two teach us to seek balance and improvement, to seek light, gain a greater understanding of it, and to share. What does this have to do with leadership? Vince Lombardi once explained that mental toughness is one of the key qualities of an ethical leader, and that love of your fellow creatures – mankind separates poor leaders from great ones. Borrowing heavily from Lombardi, I will explain. Love is loyalty. Love is teamwork. Love is respect for the dignity of others. Love is Charity. A man who belittles or speaks ill of them is not loyal and is not a leader. Masons rather are called to love others because they are people. This doesn't mean that you have to like everyone or that you should not hold them accountable when they do wrong, but it does mean that you can still learn and strive to extend them the same charity that has been extended to you.

The effort to strive to learn is the embodiment of what John the Baptist sought and John the evangelist found. This is found at that point within the circle between the two Saints John. Yours in service.

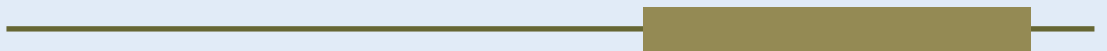
